God painted Job a picture of His unlimitedness and sovereignty. That was all Job needed to know. Ephesians tells us that God can do more than we ask or think. We

can't even imagine the extent of God's unlimitedness. God wants us to ask for His solution. **It isn't about us. It's all about Him.**
